As we continue to focus on our Zero Harm journey, I wish to bring to your attention to some great examples of how a positive approach to safety can avoid a potentially serious situation.

Since the start of the Decerto programme a 'safety pays' incentive campaign has been running to encourage all on the project to think and act proactively with a safety first mindset.

In the most recent round of awards at Lincs, Matt Mills, a Mistras rope access technician won a 1st prize award and Ryan Burnham, a Dawson technician, received a 2nd place award. Both Matt and Ryan put forward positive observations to help ensure the safe operation of our customer's Davit Cranes.

At London Array, one of the Mistras rope access teams currently working on the blades was recognised for proactively reporting a potential hazard. Not only did the team ensure the safety of others but they were also recognised for doing so as each technician received £150 worth of vouchers. The team consisted of Adam Mulholland, John McAllister and Peter King - all seen in the image alongside Site Manager Graeme Ellis, far right.

One of our lead Siemens technicians, Mark Fuller, also received a 2nd place prize award for identifying the potential risk the radar system on one of the turbines at London Array posed to the rope access teams working on the blades.
